

I'm a Little Teapot, Short and Stout



Thread: Gutermann silk S303 100/3

Cloth stitch (ctc) tapes, pivot pins on corners, backstitches, if needed, could be worked with chevron gimps if desired.

Order of work

- Lid outline – 3 pair white, 2 pair orange, winkle pin edges, ending at knob using orange pair for worker and whole stitch (ctct).
- Teapot outline starting at base – 5 pair white, 2 pair orange, sewing edges (pin under 2 pair).
- Interior design lines, spout and handle, prs as above, worked continuously, carried across teapot outline.
- Remember to work connecting lines and plaited “flower” for filling where needed.
- Pot neck – 8 pair white, cloth stitch, winkle pin edge.
- Flowers
- Center – work first with 4 pair yellow, 2 pair workers, 2 passive pair, outer sewing edge, inner winkle pin edge.
- Petals – 6 pair blue including worker, 1 pair white for outer edge, needed to work connections, bluw worked in cloth stitch with 1 or 2 twists on workers as necessary to keep nice shape. Sew into yellow sewing edge and pin holes.
- Leaf and stem fillings – green pairs as needed.
- Table base – 8 pair blue, sewing edge.
- Steam – tenstick.



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
